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1. Introduction

A knowledge share fair is a buzzing, interactive and collaborative workspace, with lively discussions and practical demonstrations. There are facilitated sessions to learn how others have improved the effectiveness and quality of their work, and opportunities for networking, allowing people to connect and link ideas as well as exchanging opinions in a natural way and relaxed setting. A share fair is not a goal in itself, but part of a process.

After the completion of the FO4ACP MTR, the FO4ACP programme partners have come to an ideal moment to exchange on good and promising practices and to include improved approaches in the second half of the programme implementation.

In light of the following factors, FO4ACP has chosen PAFO to host the Knowledge Management event. PAFO is already an implementing partner of the FO4ACP programme. It has an impeccable role to bring regional and national farmers' organizations across the entire continent together. PAFO has enough experience in organizing FO4ACP events (Start-up workshop of FO4ACP, Rural Women Summit, and Youth Summit) and it is located in the central for receiving participants from the ACP regions with headquarters in Kigali, Rwanda.

2. KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT EVENT OBJECTIVES

2.1. Main Objective

The main objective of the events is to exchange on good and promising practices among the FO4ACP implementing partners and to include improved approaches in the second half of the programme implementation.

2.2. Specific Objectives

- 1. Providing space to present the collected successful experiences in course of the FO4ACP project implementation;
- 2. Capitalization of existing local know-how generated by the practices of FO4ACP implementing partners;
- 3. Facilitating the exchange among FO4ACP implementing partners on issues affecting them under the identified thematics;

3. Scope and Structure of THE Knowledge Management event

The knowledge event will be a buzzing, interactive and collaborative workspace, with lively discussions and practical demonstrations around the three following major thematic and sub-thematic, as well as the inclusive approaches in FO4ACP activities as a cross-cutting area.

- (i) Climate change and resilience-Agroecology
- (ii) Access to finance- Business plans and their implementation
- (iii) Policy Engagement and Advocacy-Data collection for informed decisions.

There will be facilitated sessions to learn how others have improved the effectiveness and quality of their work, and opportunities for networking, allowing people to connect and link ideas as well as exchanging opinions in a natural way and relaxed setting.

Each session within the event will have a specific topic, moderator and case studies to be discussed. Breakout-groups will be organized to have more specific discussions. Each session will also have a specific knowledge sharing methodology to ensure that there is a variety among the sessions and to ensure that the tacit knowledge among the participants will be brought to the event as much as possible. Each session will have a session planning sheet.

At the event location there will also be a market place where the different participant can showcase their work through posters, products, publication, stands and share more informally with other participants or small groups of participants their successful experiences. It will be a place for meeting and exchanging during breaks and dedicated moments during the event.

7. ABOUT PAFO



With headquarters in Rwanda; PAFO was created in October 2010 by its constituent assembly under the sponsorship of the African Union. This constitutive assembly was the culmination of a process begun several years ago in collaboration with its members, five regional networks of farmers' Organizations EAFF (Eastern African Farmers Federation), PROPAC (Regional Platform of Farmers' Organizations of Central Africa), ROPPA (Network of farmers 'and producers' organizations in West Africa), SACAU (Southern African Confederation of Agricultural Unions), and UMNAGRI (Maghrebian and North African Farmers Union).

PAFO is the voice of more than 80 million African farmers integrated into nearly 73 national organizations, unions, federations, cooperatives, associations, etc., present in more than 48 countries on the continent, and united in five regional networks operating at the heart of African agriculture.

PAFO is recognized as the highest representative body of African farmers involved in crop, livestock, and fishery. The overarching objective of PAFO is: to effectively engage members in advocacy with policy-makers, and technical and financial partners and promote their participation in the formulation and implementation of the development policies and programs that affect agriculture and rural development in Africa.

8. ABOUT FO4ACP PROGRAM



The Farmers' Organizations for Africa, Caribbean and Pacific (FO4ACP) program aims to increase the incomes and improve the livelihoods, food and nutrition security, and safety of organized smallholders and family farmers in African, Caribbean and Pacific countries by strengthening regional, national and local farmers' organizations.

The program is implemented by six regional farmers' organizations, PAFO, Agricord and the FAO Regional Office for Latin America and the Caribbean. They work closely with the national FOs, agri-agencies and sub-implementing partners in about 70 countries, with a potential outreach of over 52 million smallholder farmers. Great emphasis is put on economic services, advocacy and institutional development of the membership-based FOs.

The program is funded by the European Union (EU), the Organization of African, Caribbean and Pacific States (OACPS) and the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD).

Flights' arrangements Information	Sponsored delegates will be provided with an economy fare return air ticket. The arrival will be planned according to the events for participant. Visa	From 1st Jan 2018, Nationals of all countries receive visa on arrival at Kigali International Airport and all land borders.
Visa	Citizens of countries members to the following international organizations; African Union, Commonwealth and La Francophonie get visa upon arrival and are waived visa fees for a visit of 30 days. Citizens of all countries that are not visa exempt, have also

Designation Information DSA In order to facilitate the meeting, each sponsored delegate will receive a DSA of 50€ per night. This DSA amount will allow you to support your out of meetings lunches, your dinners and any personal expenses, since your accommodation, transports, and the lunches of the meeting days are supported. **COVID-19 Measures** Covid-19 test is no longer required prior to boarding to Rwanda. Electricity

The power supply in Rwanda is 220/240V AC. It is advisable to bring your transformer for 100V AC.

In Rwanda, there are two types of plugs and sockets as shown. Please make sure you are well equipped with adapter.





Telephone and sim cards

Cell phone SIM cards are widely available in the telecommunications service centres; however, every SIM card user/buyer in Rwanda is expected by law to be registered for activation. The SIM card can be registered at the point of purchase.

Money & Banking services

Information

The currency is the Rwandan Franc (RWF). Exchange rates are subject to fluctuation. Currently, 1\$ is approximately 1,108RWF & 1€ almost 1,212 RWF.

FOREX Bureau can offer a slightly better exchange rates than most banks. There are ATMs throughout Kigali that are accessible to visitors. Banking amenities are available at all commercial banks. Major credit cards are accepted in most hotels, restaurants and shops.

Weather

Rwanda can be visited and enjoyed any time of the year. Temperatures average around 24°C (75°F), except for in the higher mountain areas where it ranges from 10° C to 15° C (50° F to 60° F).

Plastic bags

As part of an environmental protection policy, plastic bags are not allowed into Rwanda. Passengers entering Kigali International Airport, or any other border posts with plastic bags are required to discard them, and are supplied with an environmentally friendly alternative at a cost ranging from \$2-\$6.

Market Place

The Event will accommodate a market place that will showcase products from FO4ACP implementing partners.

- 12 stands will be provided to participants in outside space.
- To present videos, participants can bring laptops.
